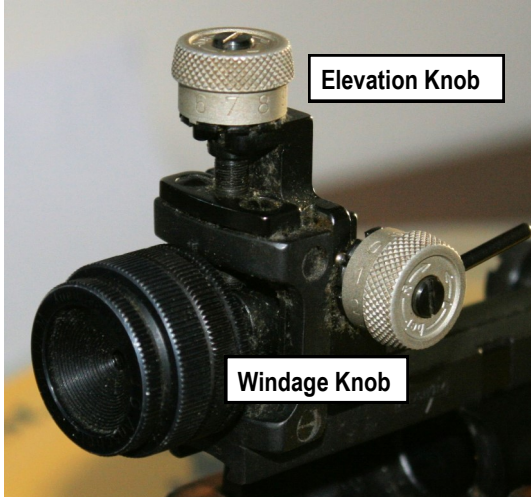

Information Sheet No. 6 Adjusting your Sights

The Anschutz rifles as used in the City of Truro Rifle Club all have similar rear sights.



The knob on the top, the 'elevation knob', adjusts the sights vertically.

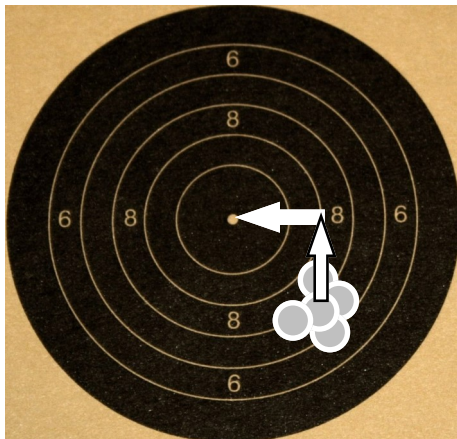
To move your shots vertically upwards, turn the knob anticlockwise.

To move your shots vertically downwards, turn the knob clockwise.

The knob on the side, the 'windage' knob, adjusts the sights horizontally.

To move your shots to the right horizontally, turn the knob anti-clockwise.

To move your shots to the left horizontally, turn the knob clockwise.



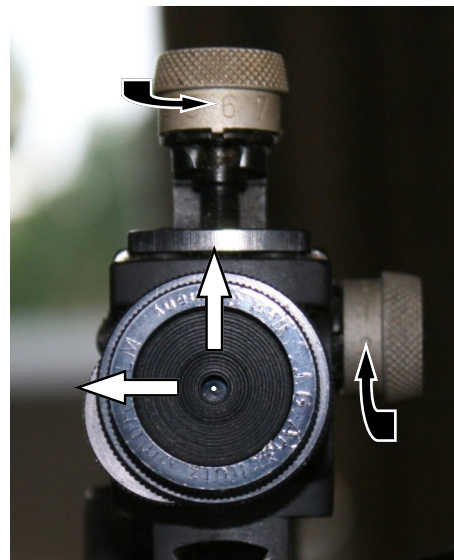
On the target to the left, the group of five shot holes are to the right and are low.

To adjust the sights to bring the next shot nearer the centre of the target, the shooter will have to adjust his sights upwards and to the left.

Using the picture of the rearsight shown on the right, the shooter needing to adjust his sights upwards and to the left, will turn:

The elevation knob anti-clockwise

The windage knob clockwise



The amount the sights move is slightly different on the various rifles, but the general 'rule of thumb' on adjusting your sights is :

THREE CLICKS PER SCORING RING ON THE TARGET
